Immaculate Conception

March 26, 2023 - Fifth Sunday of Lent

Hope



We first meet Martha because, as soon as she hears Jesus is near, she rushes to His side to speak to Him. However, Martha does not come to Jesus wailing or gnashing her teeth. On the contrary, she appears to be almost "past" her grief because she does not see Lazarus as truly dead. Some might call this denial, but she voices to Jesus that she knows He is the Son of God, and in turn sees her brother as a believer in Christ who will be resurrected.

Mary, on the other hand, is in the throes of her grief. She does not leave her house until Martha tells her that Jesus wants to see her, and as soon as she meets Jesus, she falls to the ground lamenting that He is too late. She knows that Jesus is capable of great things but she thinks that physical death is a permanent death, which would be true if Jesus was not the Son of God. She believes what the Jews had believed for centuries – that physical and spiritual death is the inevitable end for humanity because of sin – and so she grieves the loss of her brother to a perceived eternal death.

Later on Jesus also grieves to some degree by weeping at Lazarus's tomb, which seems strange given He knows what is going to happen next. Maybe this was a display of His humanity. An image of Jesus weeping certainly shows us that expressing emotion is not an expression of weakness if Christ Himself does so. Maybe He was grieving what could have been, knowing that if He wasn't there, Lazarus would have remained in death both physically and spiritually. Maybe He was thinking of His own fate, knowing that it would be Him in the tomb soon. We will never truly know, and I plan to ask Him about it when I see Him.

Beneath all this discussion of death and grief, however, lies a story about hope. When we are in a state of grief or turmoil, it is hard not to look at the world and its brokenness through the eyes of humanity like Mary. There is no hope through this lens, and there seems to be no viable escape from the constant rage, war, death, famine, planetary decline, and so on. It's no wonder we as humans struggle with mental health given that, even if we try to remove ourselves from such depressing reminders, we are constantly met with headlines, hashtags, and clickbait showing us that there is no escape.

In spite of this environment, when we look at the world through Christ's eyes like Martha, there is *only* hope. Hope in the small child helping their classmate up after a tumble. Hope in neighbors coming together to grow an inner city community garden. Hope in scientific discoveries like plastic-eating bacteria to clean our oceans and rivers. And hope in knowing that this broken world is not our eternal home. Lent is known as a period of reflection and penitence, but I think it should be remembered as a time of hope. In Old English the root word of Lent, "lencten", means "springtime." With spring comes new growth, new life. Jesus reminds the apostles and, by extension, us that the whole point of His coming to Lazarus and to the world is to restore what was there before – eternal happiness in a new life with God. May we remember this Lent that we have a choice to leave our eternal tomb for new life. A choice given to us because He left His first.


Parish Events & News...

Lenten Regulations...

- 1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent.
- **2.** Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is also bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- **3.** On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. The other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but altogether they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the obligation of the law is modified. Because Lent is a special season for all Christians, we should not lightly excuse ourselves from these penitential practices.
- **4.** To completely disregard the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.




