## Are you a "Practicing Catholic?"

We are ten days into our Lenten journey. We have thirty days to go, and God continues to call us deeper into faith. So, how's your faith and what more might the Lord be asking of you?

Around this time of Lent, I find it helpful to go back to the basics and ask myself, "Am I a good Catholic and how am I 'practicing' my faith?" So, what does it mean to be a "practicing Catholic" anyway? According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the following five precepts (tools) are given to guide our lives and are requirements to be considered a practicing Catholic:

~Attend Mass every Sunday of the year and on Holy Days of Obligation. The most important time and place

to develop a relationship with God is Mass. The Church teaches us that Sundays and Holy Day Masses are essential to our faith. It's one hour a week when we are reminded to "love God above all the obligation of going to Mass each Sunday can't be set aside for anything less than a serious reason. No "walking the dog," "preferring to sleep in," "I don't like the priest," "there's a Cardinal baseball game to get to" (insert here any other human activity that you enjoy)," or "I didn't want to" are not good reasons! Sickness, hospitalization, immobility, horrible weather and traveling in the most northern regions of the Yukon are!

**~Go to Confession at least once a year, typically during Lent.** The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a beautiful sacrament, but a humbling one. It reminds us that we are not perfect. We sin. We need God's forgiveness which then helps us to be reconciled with each other. In essence, this sacrament helps us love God and our neighbor better.



~Receive Communion at least once a year. Most Catholics in the United States find this one easy to do.

We have been trained that God loves us and that the Eucharist is one of God's ways of showing us 302 this. Jesus died for us and the Eucharist is what He left for us. For some of us, however, we don't feel worthy of so much love. In a feeling of sinfulness, we turn away from receiving His Body and Blood. The Church invites us back into His love always, but at least once a year in the reception of Holy

Communion.

~Observe "fasting" and "abstinence" as established by the Church. This rule used to be much tougher. Every Friday of the year was a day of fasting and abstaining from meat, but now the only time we must fast is Ash Wednesday, the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. Again, the purpose of this one is to remind us how much material goods we actually have while what we truly need to make us happy is God. We fast and abstain from selfishness so that we can turn to God for our needs.






~Provide for the material needs of the Church. Time, Treasure and Talent! What more is the Lord calling you to do to help Immaculate Conception Parish live its' stewardship of NEEDS YOU! spirituality?

Remember, without your time, treasure and talent, we aren't living fully as a stewardship parish.

According to the Catholic Catechism these five tools are given by the Church to help us deepen our faith and live out a relationship with God. Put simply, to be a "practicing Catholic," we must live the Ten Commandments (loving God above all else, and our neighbor as ourselves) and assent to Catholic Church teaching...topics for future bulletin covers! Suffice it to say, Lent.



## Lenten Regulations...

 Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent.
 Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is also bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
 On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. The other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but altogether they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the obligation of the law is modified. Because Lent is a special season for all Christians, we should not lightly excuse ourselves from these penitential practices. 4. To completely disregard the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

### Charítable Gíving...

Donors receive an immediate tax deduction for contributions into their Donor-Advised Fund.




