# Remember your first thanksgiving?

On Saturday morning, about 60 second graders assembled, fueled by doughnuts (every year I question my judgment), and worked with their parents and other volunteers to dive into the meaning of their First Holy Eucharist.

They display their banners, paint blessing cups, put together a workbook demonstrating that they know how to participate in the Mass ("We do!"), and have a taste of the unconsecrated host ("It's plain!"). We pray as a group and I get to remind them that the word "Eucharist" comes from a Greek word

meaning "thanksgiving." It's my second favorite part of the day, talking about a meal that is very different from turkey and cranberries. But do they understand?

St. Pius X, when he was a pope, decided that age seven was an excellent age to receive the Living Bread for the first time, saying these little ones had reached the Age of Reason and were able to fully participate in the sacrifice of the Mass. It seems counterintuitive that we should entrust the Body of Jesus to hands that routinely–well, you know, they're children!

But we are asked as grown ups to have the faith of children, and Pope Pius X was wonderfully wise, recognizing that their hearts and imaginations were more than capable of understanding that God-very unfairly (they are experts in equity)-died for something that is our fault. They know Love and Gift and Gratitude. They absolutely understand the need to give thanks for death-to-eternal life.

My most favorite activity is when they write letters to Jesus, which we will hang in church along with their banners to remind our whole congregation just how special the Eucharist is. The example here is from a few years ago. I pray it every time I go through my door.

- *RCIA* (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults): The RCIA is for everyone who has been drawn by God to form a deeper relationship. #### Naming a charity as the beneficiary of your IRA or 401(K)

If you wish to make a gift to charity as part of your estate planning, making that gift by naming the charity as the direct beneficiary of your IRA or 401(k) can not only benefit the charity, but can also have tax advantages for your non-charitable beneficiaries (e.g. children or other loved ones). Because traditional IRA and 401(k) accounts are tax-deferred, if one or more individuals inherits the account from you, that individual beneficiary will have to pay income taxes when he or she withdraws the funds from the account. However, if a charity is named, the charity receives the assets tax free. So, if you were to leave a gift to a charity from non-IRA or non-401 (k) assets via a Will or Revocable Living Trust, but leave your IRA or 401(k) to an individual, the charity would receive the same amount, but the individual would have his or her share of your IRA or 401(k) depleted by income taxes and would actually receive less money overall than if the charity received your desired amount from your IRA or 401(k) and the individual received his or her share from your other assets. Also, if your IRA or 401(k) is larger than your total desired gift to charity, you have the option to allocate only a percentage of the account to charity and provide that the balance be paid to your other beneficiary(ies). This does not apply to a Roth IRA because Roth IRAs received by beneficiaries are not subject to income taxes. ~ IC Planned Giving Committee




