

The Stone Which the Builders Rejected...

Every year, I have the honor and fun of composing a song that is used for our Immaculate Conception School theme. This was something that started back when Fr. Steve Gira was our pastoral associate. He and Fr. Carl worked on a theme together back then and I soon became part of the planning process.

So, the year that our "new" church was being built, I came up here and sat on the property asking God to give me some ideas for a theme. That was the inception of the song entitled "*Living Stones*," commonly known around here as "Upon This Rock."

Therefore, when I looked at the readings for this weekend having volunteered for this bulletin cover, I was excited to see that the story of the rejected corner stone is found in our second reading. I wonder how many things/ideas/people any of us have "rejected" over time that could have turned out to be a central point to our becoming?

It gives one pause to consider this, as we navigate our "cancel culture." There are times and situations where rejection of an idea, concept, or even a human

seems appropo. And yet, I am just pondering if perhaps we really need to be mindful of what gets "cancelled." Because, Jesus obviously was rejected and yet became the cornerstone. Jesus is also our model for befriending those rejected, those on the margins. These become the recipients of God's grace and mercy.

And then there is this amazing, amazing gospel. The words "Do not let your hearts be troubled" are balm for my soul. Philip's words from the gospel of John begging Jesus to be shown the Father. Jesus then telling him basically, "Um, you have SEEN the Father. Right here." Wow. Attempted cancellation became our Living Bread.

Going back to reading 2 again from 1 Peter: "let yourselves be built into a spiritual house." What a beautiful Easter goal and Easter message. May our eyes be open to the cornerstone and may we join in the journey of being part of the holy priesthood! May you be the Christ shining for all and may you see the Christ shining in all.

We celebrate Baptisms on the 1st Sunday of the month during any Mass, and the 3rd Sunday of the month after the 11 a.m. Mass. (No Baptisms are scheduled during Lent.) - *Weddings:* Please contact the Parish Office a minimum of four months prior to Marriage.
- Anointing of the Sick & Funerals: Since individual needs differ, please contact the Parish Office at 281-5105 for pastoral care. Do not hesitate to call; we are grateful for the opportunity to open our hearts to you and your family and offer these sacramental services.
- *RCIA* (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults): The RCIA is for everyone who has been drawn by God to form a deeper relationship. Wherever you are in your faith practice baptized in another Christian faith, starting from the beginning, or simply enriching your Catholic practice consider the RCIA. Get to know God better and find out what it means to be Catholic. School Board


- Serve as an advisory group to support the Principal and Pastor in developing and implementing school policies.



Naming a charity as the beneficiary of your IRA or 401(K)

If you wish to make a gift to charity as part of your estate planning, making that gift by naming the charity as the direct beneficiary of your IRA or 401(k) cannot only benefit the charity, but can also have tax advantages for your non-charitable beneficiaries (e.g. children or other loved ones). Because traditional IRA and 401(k) accounts are tax-deferred, if one or more individuals inherits the account from you, that individual beneficiary will have to pay income taxes when he or she withdraws the funds from the account. However, if a charity is named, the charity receives the assets tax free. So, if you were to leave a gift to a charity from non-IRA or non-401 (k) assets via a Will or Revocable Living Trust, but leave your IRA or 401(k) to an individual, the charity would receive the same amount, but the individual would have his or her share of your IRA or 401(k) depleted by income taxes and would actually receive less money overall than if the charity received your desired amount from your IRA or 401(k) and the individual received his or her share from your other assets. Also, if your IRA or 401(k) is larger than your total desired gift to charity, you have the option to allocate only a percentage of the account to charity and provide that the balance be paid to your other beneficiary(ies). This does not apply to a Roth IRA because Roth IRAs received by beneficiaries are not subject to income taxes. ~ IC Planned Giving Committee




