See God in Everything

It is time to welcome all the students and staff back to school!!! I always get excited this time of year. I look forward to seeing all the students, hearing about their summer, and being amazed how much they have grown over the past three months. (I know most parents are excited, too, this time of year but it is usually not for the same reasons I am.) The theme for this year at ICS is "See God in Everything." This can be easy and challenging

at the same time. I feel the "trick" to living this lies in the word "See." We are taught from a very early age that God is everywhere and a part of everything in our lives. We determine if we want to "see" God in everything or not.

The 2nd week of July, I found myself, along with my wife Lois, overlooking and hiking through Bryce Canyon and also bike riding through and repelling into deep beautiful crevices in Zion Canyon in Utah. It is so easy to "see" God when you experience sights like these.

A week before our trip to Utah, a storm came through Columbia. I am sure you all have your stories about the storm on June 30th: power lines down, limbs broken off trees that were scattered on roofs, roads, and driveways, and giant trees uprooted from the ground. At the end of the road we live on, the largest tree in our subdivision was uprooted that night. The ball of roots was at least 10 feet in diameter. It is a challenge to "see" God in this. Most might "see" that God destroyed this magnificent tree. Maybe we need to "see" the magnificent ball of roots as a reminder of the underlying faith, intellect, and love we are developing in the students at ICS.

The theme does not only have to be practiced at ICS this school year. I challenge all of you to practice it in your lives together as parishioners of Immaculate Conception. No matter how challenging or easy it may seem at times, always remember that God is in everything; you just need to open your eyes and see Him. Here's to a great 23-24 school year as we strive to fulfill our mission:

Baptisms: Parents/guardians are asked to attend a Preparation Seminar scheduled on the second Sunday of the month after 9:00 a.m. Mass (approximately 10:00 a.m.) in the lower-level library. We celebrate Baptisms on the first Sunday of the month during any Mass, and the third Sunday of the month after the 11:00 a.m. Mass. (No Baptisms are scheduled during Lent.) Please call the office to schedule at 281-5105.

Weddings: Please contact the Parish Office a minimum of four months prior to Marriage.

Anointing of the Sick & Funerals: Since individual needs differ, please contact the Parish Office at 281-5105 for pastoral care. Do not hesitate to call; we are grateful for the opportunity to open our hearts to you and your family and offer these sacramental services.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults): The RCIA is for everyone who has been drawn by God to form a deeper relationship. Wherever you are in your faith practice – baptized in another Christian faith, starting from the beginning, or simply enriching your Catholic practice – consider the RCIA. Get to know God better and find out what it means to be Catholic. (Rom 2:15). But, when we enmesh ourselves in lies and foolishness, our conscience becomes more and more difficult to hear. Therefore, we must diligently discern truth and develop wisdom ourselves and seek truth and wisdom in others.


GIBAULT MEN'S CLUB FULL MOON RIDE

SINKING DOUBT


Reflection on Matthew 14:22-33

Peter, the "rock" upon whom Jesus will build His Church, sinks like a rock in today's Gospel. Jesus' outstretched hand saves Peter, in his doubt born of the strong wind, from sinking.

There seems to be a universal disenchantment today with leaders and authorities in all our institutions – government, church, business, and education – because they come wrapped in faith that sometimes falters, character that sometimes stumbles, vision that sometimes goes murky. Not only can they not walk on water, but they cannot even swim either. Of course, the same is true of all of us.

The Swiss psychiatrist, Carl Jung, had these words inscribed above the door of his office: "Called or not, God is present." SAINT JOHN EUDES

Feast Day: August 8

Patron Saint of: Astronomers

John joined the religious community of the Oratorians and was ordained a priest at 24. During severe plagues in 1627 and 1631, he volunteered to care for the stricken in his own diocese.

At age 32, John became a parish missionary. His gifts as a preacher and confessor won him great popularity. He preached over 100 parish missions, some lasting from several weeks to several months.

In his concern with the spiritual improvement of the clergy, John realized that the greatest need was for seminaries. After prayer and counsel, John decided it was best to leave the religious community. That same year John founded a new community, ultimately called the Eudists—the Congregation of Jesus and Marydevoted to the formation of the clergy by conducting diocesan seminaries.

In his parish mission work, John was disturbed by the sad condition of prostitutes who sought to escape their miserable life. Temporary shelters were found, but arrangements were not satisfactory. A certain Madeleine Lamy, who had cared for several of the women, one day said to him, "Where are you off to now? To some church, I suppose, where you'll gaze at the images and think yourself pious. And all the time what is really wanted of you is a decent house for these poor creatures." The words, and the laughter of those present, struck deeply within him. The result was another new religious community, called the Sisters of Charity of the Refuge. Holiness is the wholehearted openness to the love of God. It is visibly expressed in many ways, but the variety of expression has one common quality: concern for the needs of others.
