**Baptisms:** Parents/guardians are asked to attend a Preparation Seminar scheduled on the second Sunday of the month after 9:00 a.m. Mass (approximately 10:00 a.m.) in the lower-level library. We celebrate Baptisms on the first Sunday of the month during any Mass, and the third Sunday of the month after the 11:00 a.m. Mass. (No Baptisms are scheduled during Lent.) Please call the office to schedule at 281-5105.

**Weddings:** Please contact the Parish Office a minimum of four months prior to Marriage.

Anointing of the Sick & Funerals: Since individual needs differ, please contact the Parish Office at 281-5105 for pastoral care. Do not hesitate to call; we are grateful for the opportunity to open our hearts to you and your family and offer these sacramental services.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults): The RCIA is for everyone who has been drawn by God to form a deeper relationship. Wherever you are in your faith practice – baptized in another Christian faith, starting from the beginning, or simply enriching your Catholic practice – consider the RCIA. What type of faith is great? Great faith is that which brings its own story, marked even by wounds, and brings it to the Lord's feet asking Him to heal them, to give them meaning. Each one of us has our own story and it is not always a story "of export," it is not always a clean story... Many times, it is a difficult story, with a lot of pain, many misfortunes and many sins. What do I do with my story? Do I hide it? No! We must bring it before the Lord. "Lord, if You will it, You can heal me!" This is what this woman teaches us: the courage to bring our own painful story before God, before Jesus, to touch God's tenderness, Jesus' tenderness. Let's try this story, this prayer: let each one of us think of his or her own story. There are always ugly things in a story, always. Let us go to Jesus, knock on Jesus' heart and say to Him: "Lord, if You will it, You can heal me!"



#### **BOLDLY PRAY**


Reflection on Matthew 15:21-28

Early in life, our parents begin to teach us our manners, how to be polite – our "please" and "thank-you" – all the words and actions we will need to be respectful of others and not embarrass ourselves (or our parents!) in public. All of this socialization serves us well as we move through life, even in how we relate to God.

Today's Gospel compels us to consider a different dimension of relating to God: with boldness, persistence, even a bit of an argumentative spirit. There is precedence for how this Canaanite woman converses with Jesus. Think of Abraham arguing with God as to whether the city of Sodom might be spared destruction. Think of the Psalmist demanding of God better treatment than his people are getting at the moment (Psalm 44). These are the prayers that end with exclamation points!

Some would argue that this is how Jesus Himself taught us to pray: "Give us this day our daily bread. Forgive our sins. Deliver us from evil." These are straightforward and confident requests. However, whatever our prayer request might be, and however boldly we bring it to the altar, we always must submit to God's veto, precisely because He is our Lord. "Your will be done" is always a good ending to every prayer.

### **SAINT ROSE OF LIMA**

Feast Day: August 23 Patron Saint of: Florists

She was born to parents of Spanish descent in Lima, Peru, at a time when South America was in its first century of evangelization. She seems to have taken Catherine of Siena as a model, in spite of the objections and ridicule of parents and friends.

When her parents fell into financial trouble, she worked in the garden all day and sewed at night. Ten years of struggle against her parents began when they tried to make Rose marry. They refused to let her enter a convent, and out of obedience she continued her life of penance and solitude at home as a member of the Third Order of Saint Dominic. So deep was her desire to live the life of Christ that she spent most of her time at home in solitude.

During the last few years of her life, Rose set up a room in the house where she cared for homeless children, the elderly, and the sick. This was a beginning of social services in Peru. Though secluded in life and activity, she was brought to the attention of Inquisition interrogators, who could only say that she was influenced by grace.

What might have been a merely eccentric life was transfigured from the inside. If we remember some unusual penances, we should also remember the greatest thing about Rose: a love of God so ardent that it withstood ridicule from without, violent temptation, and lengthy periods of sickness. When she died at 31, the city turned out for her funeral. Prominent men took turns carrying her coffin.

We enjoy the most comfort-oriented life in human history. We eat too much, drink too much, use a million gadgets, fill our eyes and ears with everything imaginable. Commerce thrives on creating useless needs on which to spend our money. It seems that when we have become most like slaves, there is the greatest talk of "freedom." Are we willing to discipline ourselves in such an atmosphere?


