Sacraments

Baptism

Baptism of infants and children under the age of seven is generally celebrated on the first Sunday of the month during any Mass, and the third Sunday of the month after the 11:00 a.m. Mass. (No Baptisms are scheduled during Lent). Please call the office to schedule at 281-5105.

The parents must provide assurance that they will bring the child up in the Catholic faith. The parents' active practice of the faith is generally the evidence of this commitment. Parents must attend a baptismal preparation session before the baptism of their first child. This session is also recommended for godparents. Baptismal preparation sessions are held on the second Sunday of each month (except when Palm Sunday or Easter fall on a second Sunday) at 10:10 a.m. in the Garden Level. There are no reservations required for the class. At the class you will be given the paperwork to fill out for your child's baptismal certificate. Please call the parish office (281-5105) to schedule your child's baptism when you are ready.

First Eucharist and First Reconciliation

These sacraments are generally received for the first time by 2nd graders in ICS and ICPSR. At least two years of faith formation and sacramental preparation is required prior to the reception of this sacrament. Those who are beyond the 2nd grade can make arrangements with Lizanne Young, Director of Faith Formation, to receive these sacraments for the first time.

Confirmation

The Sacrament is generally received by 8th graders who attend Immaculate Conception School (ICS) and the Parish School of Religion (ICPSR). At least two years of faith formation and sacramental preparation are required prior to the reception of this sacrament.

Marriage

Celebrating the Sacrament of Marriage with our parishioners is an especially joyous and significant part of our ministry that requires careful preparation. Please contact the parish at least six months prior to the desired wedding date. Our parish has a wedding policy as a resource for planning the celebration.

Anointing of the Sick

The Sacrament of Anointing is given on request to any Catholic who is seriously ill, hospitalized or has deteriorating health because of advanced years. It is most appropriate to celebrate the sacrament while the sick person is alert and able to participate in the Church's prayer. **Please contact the parish office if you are aware of a parishioner who is hospitalized. The hospitals' increasing concern about privacy and security, as well as the large number of hospitals where our parishioners are patients, make it difficult for the staff to discover all of our hospitalized brothers and sisters.

Information on Rental of the Garden Level

Parishioners may rent the Garden Level and Warming Kitchen for 150 people or less for \$175. Full Stewardship members do not pay rent, but pay a \$75 cleaning fee. Everyone using the facility must fill out the rental agreement and initial the proof of insurance on form before booking is complete. You will also be asked for a copy of your policy that indicates that you have insurance that will cover the rental. To schedule an event or check availability, please call Michelle at the parish office (281-5105). If you rent the space, you are responsible for the event. **We do not allow sub-rental of space for third parties.**

Ministries

ACTS Retreat: An ACTS (Adoration, Community, Theology, Service) Retreat is a parish-based event which offers parishioners an opportunity to experience the love of Jesus Christ. This in turn fosters a desire for intentional discipleship. Bereavement: Offers comfort and healing presence to those experiencing the death of a loved one. This may extend from the time of death, through the wake service and Mass of Christian burial, and on through the first anniversary of the death. A Bereavement Ministry member(s) may attend the wake service or funeral Mass to provide prayers and assistance to family and guests. The Ministry has offered such programs as a "Remembering" service gathering in memory of deceased Mothers, Fathers and Veterans; an event "Love Lives On" for grieving children; and a prayer "Walk to Remember" in memory of the babies lost to stillbirth, miscarriage, lost adoptions, and abortion. Family members and friends of the deceased are encouraged to attend a special ceremony at the annual All Soul's Day Mass. A Remembrance/Sharing Gathering takes place in the late fall. Family members are provided grief support through the "Journeying through Grief" book series during the first year. A Remembrance Table is available in church to place loved ones' pictures, prayer cards, etc.

Meetings are held on the second Thursday of the month as necessary.
