Candles play varied roles in our lives from illuminating our surroundings when there is a power outage to creating scariness in our jack-o-lanterns by highlighting the visage carved in the pumpkin. As small children we delight in having an added candle each year on the birthday cake. A candle in the window was a sign that a loved one was away from home serving in the military. Romantic, other special, and holiday dinners are frequently eaten by candlelight. The illusion of candlelight is available by purchasing battery operated candles with handheld remotes.

Candles also have many uses in our church lives. Upon walking into church, one sees the Sanctuary lantern, the Easter Candle, and the votive candles that have been lit for family members and other loved ones that are ill or have died or other personal reasons. Candles are lit prior to celebrating Holy Mass and other liturgical services. Processions are led with candles. At ICC we have an annual All Souls Mass on November 2nd when we recognize the loss of loved ones in our personal and church families who have died in the previous twelve months. During Mass each name is read aloud as a chime is sounded and a candle is lit. A family member is welcome to take a candle home. Some families incorporate that candle into their holiday celebrations to remember their loved one. We hope that this candle lightens the gloom of bereavement and calls to mind past celebrations of life.

The Bereavement Ministry personally invites families of the recently deceased to attend this Mass. We also invite all parishioners whether or not they have recently lost a loved one to come and offer solace to members of their church family. Let us all provide light and love in a world that too frequently dwells in darkness as we remember the Souls on their way to sainthood.

# Sacramental Information

**Baptisms:** Parents/guardians are asked to attend a Preparation Seminar scheduled on the second Sunday of the month after 9:00 a.m. Mass (approximately 10:00 a.m.) in the lower-level library. We celebrate Baptisms on the first Sunday of the month during any Mass, and the third Sunday of the month after the 11:00 a.m. Mass. (No Baptisms are scheduled during Lent.) Please call the office to schedule at 281-5105.

Weddings: The parish is happy to celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony with adults who are currently registered members of Immaculate Conception Church (bride or groom). If you are one of many who would like to "come home" to celebrate the Sacrament with family and friends, please provide the name of the parish where you are now a member, along with contact information. We ask that you contact the IC Parish Office a minimum of four months prior to Marriage, but in most cases couples will need to allow time for Pre-Cana formation, and we suggest beginning to plan your Sacrament 12 or 18 months prior to Marriage.

Anointing of the Sick & Funerals: Since individual needs differ, please contact the Parish Office at 281-5105 for pastoral care. Do not hesitate to call; we are grateful for the opportunity to open our hearts to you and your family and offer these sacramental services.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults): The RCIA is for everyone who has been drawn by God to form a deeper relationship. Wherever you are in your faith practice – baptized in another Christian faith, starting from the beginning, or simply enriching your Catholic practice – consider the RCIA. Get to know God better and find out what it means to be Catholic. We meet in the Parish Office on Sundays (September-Easter), starting with "Breaking Open the Word" dismissal from 9:00 a.m. Mass, and catechetical sessions from 10:00-11:30 a.m. Contact Lizanne Young at the Parish Office at 281-5105, ext. 354, or email lyoung@iccmail.org.

**Reconciliation:** Reconciliation is offered from 4:00-4:30 p.m. on Saturdays and by appointment.




