## What Are We Learning?

- 4th The 4th graders spent some time in church last week praying quietly for a few minutes. Mike taught us the 4 types of
  prayers using the acronym: ACTS. A=Adoration C=Contrition T=Thanksgiving S=Supplication. We also learned that
  beatitude means "blessing" and that the Beatitudes auide us to show mercy and be a blessina for others.
- 3rdOur third grade class continued our Old Testament scripture journey by studying the story of Abraham and Issac. We witnessed a loving father, willing to offer his only son as a sacrifice, only to see angels intercede and protect Issac from harm. Our class discussed how God the Father also sacrificed His only Son to earth to die for our sins, and deliver eternal salvation.

In part two, we learned about the "major parts" of the Mass and what each component of the Introductory Rite, the Litural of the Word, Litural of the Eucharist, and the Concluding Rite.

We discussed and practiced our responses to each of these sections, and had some fun with a group activity to test our knowledge of the Mass.

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time Wisdom 6:12-16 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 Matthew 25:1-13

# What Are We Learning?

1<sup>st</sup> We talked about how Jesus teaches love and making good and bad choices. This lead into the 10 Commandments which we will return to in a later November class.

8<sup>th</sup> grade is having discussions about what it means to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, and why the Church has this sacrament in the first place. We have discussed how the early Christians came to know each other during a time when being Christian could be a death sentence. It was necessary that this early faith community be "confirmed" in their beliefs, and that new members have sponsors who could speak to their strong faith and trustworthiness. Today, being confirmed as a Catholic means that someone has completed all the Sacraments of Initiation, and can boldly live their faith in all aspects of their lives.
