

## Sister Parish — Our Next Journey — July 2024

January 7 is the feast day of St. Raymond of Penafort, the patron saint of our sister parish in Guatemala. Depending on who you talk to at Immaculate Conception on the topic of our Sister Parish, you would likely get a number of different reactions. For many parishioners, their main connection to St. Raymond's is through financial support, as evidenced by the generosity of their monthly contributions. For others, the connection is primarily spiritual, known only to the individual parishioner when he/she prays. Still others are reminded of St. Raymond's when they notice the framed photos from our 2018 mission trip – these are the pictures that hang on the walls in the gathering space. When it comes to Immaculate Conception students, St. Raymond's is something they discuss in Spanish class or at other parish events when cultural awareness issues are raised. Then again, there are some parishioners for whom there is little or no connection to St. Raymond's and for whom its mention elicits no reaction at all.



In July 2024, ICC parishioners will once again travel to Guatemala to stand in solidarity with the community of St. Raymond's. We go there to listen, not with our ears, but with our hearts; to turn our eyes toward those in need; to use our hands to lift up and be lifted up; and to walk in faith with others like ourselves. As we begin our spiritual preparation, we ask for your prayers not just for us but for those who will journey with us while in Guatemala.

The pictures included here are of a few of the people who will join us on our travels. They include Padre Abdias, the pastor at St. Raymond's. He hopes to visit ICC in the near future. Next up is Carlos, a 12-year-old sixth grader whose favorite subjects are math & PE. Sound like anyone you know? Ingrid is next. She's a primary school teacher, with 24 students in her care. In particular, she likes to help children going through difficulties at home – just like many teachers we know.

<u>THESE ARE THE FACES OF ST. RAYMOND'S</u>. Are they not also a reflection of us? When we return to ICC next summer, it is our hope that Padre Abdias, Carlos, Ingrid, and the others will not just be remembered as pictures in a bulletin, but will forever live in our hearts and in yours.

## Sacramental Information

**Baptisms:** Parents/guardians are asked to attend a Preparation Seminar scheduled on the second Sunday of the month after 9:00 a.m. Mass (approximately 10:00 a.m.) in the lower-level library. We celebrate Baptisms on the first Sunday of the month during any Mass, and the third Sunday of the month after the 11:00 a.m. Mass. (No Baptisms are scheduled during Lent.) Please call the office to schedule at 281-5105.

Weddings: The parish is happy to celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony with adults who are currently registered members of Immaculate Conception Church (bride or groom). If you are one of many who would like to "come home" to celebrate the Sacrament with family and friends, please provide the name of the parish where you are now a member, along with contact information. We ask that you contact the IC Parish Office a minimum of four months prior to Marriage, but in most cases couples will need to allow time for Pre-Cana formation, and we suggest beginning to plan your Sacrament 12 or 18 months prior to Marriage.

Anointing of the Sick & Funerals: Since individual needs differ, please contact the Parish Office at 281-5105 for pastoral care. Do not hesitate to call; we are grateful for the opportunity to open our hearts to you and your family and offer these sacramental services.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults): The RCIA is for everyone who has been drawn by God to form a deeper relationship. Wherever you are in your faith practice – baptized in another Christian faith, starting from the beginning, or simply enriching your Catholic practice – consider the RCIA. Get to know God better and find out what it means to be Catholic. We meet in the Parish Office on Sundays (September-Easter), starting with "Breaking Open the Word" dismissal from 9:00 a.m. Mass, and catechetical sessions from 10:00-11:30 a.m. Contact Lizanne Young at the Parish Office at 281-5105, ext. 354, or email lyoung@iccmail.org.

Reconciliation: Reconciliation is offered from 4:00-4:30 p.m. on Saturdays and by appointment.



### PAYROLL TAX WITHHOLDING

As we start the new year 2024, it's time to consider reviewing your payroll tax withholding for the following:

- When the tax law changes
- When you have life changes:
  - Lifestyle Marriage, divorce, birth or adoption of a child, home purchase, retirement, filing Chapter 11 bankruptcy
  - Wage income You or your spouse start or stop working or start or stop a second job
  - Taxable income not subject to withholding Interest income, dividends, capital gains, self-employment income, IRA (including certain Roth IRA) distributions
  - Adjustments to income IRA deduction, student loan interest deduction, alimony expense
  - Itemized deductions or tax credits Medical expenses, taxes, interest expense, gifts to charity, dependent care expenses, education credit, child tax credit, earned income credit

To Change Your Withholding:

Note: You may use the results from the IRS Tax Withholding Estimator:

Tax Withholding Estimator | Internal Revenue Service (irs.gov) To change your tax withholding you should:

- Complete a new Form W-4, Employees Withholding Allowance Certificate, and submit it to your employer.
- Complete a new Form W-4P, Withholding Certificate for Pension or Annuity Payments, and submit it to your payer
- Make an additional or estimated tax payment to the IRS before the end of the year.

Pope Francis Says...

The growing problem of marine waste and the protection of the open seas represents particular challenges. What is needed is an agreement on systems of governance for the whole range of so-called "global commons." (Laudato, Si 174)

What can I do? Refuse and reduce the use of plastics. Use laundry sheets, bar soap and shampoo. Use cloth shopping bags.

## Discipleship

The Gospels were written in Greek. When Jesus speaks of giving "alms," the Greek word is "eleemosuna" - the root meaning of which is "pity." The origin of the word "alms" (taken from the first few letters of the long Greek word) provides insight into the difference between Almsgiving and Stewardship.

Almsgiving results from feelings of pity and compassion for someone in need. It is a good step in the right direction, and it is one of the seven Corporal Works of Mercy.

Stewardship goes one step further. It is an action caused not simply by feelings of tenderness toward a needy person. It is an expression of gratitude to God for everything we have, and the belief that the earth and all that is in it belongs to God.

Almsgiving flows from compassion. Stewardship flows from the recognition that all human beings belong to one family. This moves me to take part of what I have (off the top) and simply share it with the family.

To see things that way, and to act that way, is Stewardship.

### Vocations...

The Diocese of Belleville is hosting an informational meeting for men (and their spouses) who are interested in the Permanent Diaconate. This meeting will take place on Saturday, February 3, 2024, at 10:00 a.m. in the Undercroft of the Cathedral of St. Peter, 200 W. Harrison Street, Belleville, IL 62220.

The Office of Permanent Deacon is considering another new class of aspirants starting in the fall of 2025. Eligibility is extended to men who have reached the ages thirty-three (33) to fifty-six (56) by September 2025. Men older than fifty-six may still apply but require special approval from the Deacon Formation Office and the Bishop.

The formation process is a five-year commitment, including academic studies conducted by St. Meinrad School of Theology, spiritual direction, and learning about the deacon's role. Participants are required to attend a three-day meeting once per month over the course of the five-year program.

Interested individuals should first discuss their interest with their pastor. For those unable to attend the initial meeting, another session will be scheduled later. This meeting is an opportunity to learn about the process and requirements for becoming a Permanent Deacon in the Diocese.



Losing a loved one to suicide or any tragic death is a pain that no one can prepare for. The roller coaster of emotions is enough to make one doubt God's presence in the situation.


This day of reflection is designed to help in the journey through these emotions and come out renewed with confidence in God's love and care for each one of us.




