Baptisms: Parents/guardians are asked to attend a Preparation Seminar scheduled on the second Sunday of the month after 9:00 a.m. Mass (approximately 10:00 a.m.) in the lower-level library. We celebrate Baptisms on the first Sunday of the month during any Mass, and the third Sunday of the month after the 11:00 a.m. Mass. (No Baptisms are scheduled during Lent.) Please call the office to schedule at 281-5105.

Weddings: The parish is happy to celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony with adults who are currently registered members of Immaculate Conception Church (bride or groom). If you are one of many who would like to "come home" to celebrate the Sacrament with family and friends, please provide the name of the parish where you are now a member, along with contact information. WILLS AND LIVING TRUSTS

In the world of estate planning, Wills and Living Trusts often take center stage because they are the most common documents used to pass assets after one's death. They are similar, yet different – kind of like siblings, but without all the fighting. Both are legal tools that transfer your property to those you love. The main difference is that one can be effective while you are still alive and the other goes into effect only after you die. There are a few more important distinctions you should know about. Let's go over each one, starting with the basics, so you can decide what's best for you.

What Is a Will?

A Will is a legal document that explains what you want to have happen when you die – and puts it all in writing. It outlines things like who you want to get your property, your money, and guardianship of your kids or pets. The important thing to note about a Will is that it does not avoid the probate process, which is a common misconception. When you die, the person(s) you've named as Personal Representative (a.k.a Executor), must present your Will to the court in the county where you reside at death and ask the judge to recognize your Will as valid and grant what are known as "letters testamentary" to the person(s) you've name. It is only then that your Personal Representative has the legal authority to administer the terms of your Will.

What Is a Living Trust?

A Living Trust is a legal document that governs what happens to your assets during your lifetime as well as at death, quickly and easily. It's referred to as "living" because the Trust goes into effect while you're alive, as opposed to a Will, which only becomes effective at your death. You can transfer things like bank or savings accounts, cars, real estate, art, jewelry and even intellectual property (like your novel manuscript) into a Living Trust. There are several significant advantages that a Living Trust provides that a Will does not. Those include incapacity planning – your Trustee (i.e. the person(s) you've designated to manage trust assets after you can no longer do it yourself) can manage your trust assets for you if you become incapacitated; privacy – the actions taken under a Living Trust are private between your Trustee and your beneficiaries; and probate avoidance – a Living Trust if properly funded will avoid the probate process, where a Will does not. Also Living Trusts, just like Wills, can be changed or completely rewritten as many times as you determine necessary prior to your incapacity or death. When a Living Trust is used as the primary estate planning document, a Will is still recommended to "catch" any property that was not placed in your Living Trust prior to your death, and to then add that property to your Trust at that time.



Discipleship

The second reading from James talks of faith and/or works. The age-old debate continues. When I was little we were taught to "give the shirt off your back." This was a hard lesson since I tended to take things literally. I understood it to mean that Catholics couldn't have nice things. I had enough fear of the Lord that I was always seen as "generous" in my giving, but had loads of guilt over the few nice things I had and found myself less than confident of my chance of salvation. As an adult I met a Baptist with a strong confidence in her salvation...it had been already bought and paid for by Jesus' death on the cross. I had never seen a stronger faith in a person's salvation, however, she came across as uppity and condescending. Her matterof-fact tone was sharp as she was quick to tell people how they made a mistake. I found myself having to defend her to others and assure them she was a kind and loving person that would go the extra mile to help them and make sure a task was done well. Which is more important, faith or works? Whatever you choose to believe, please let it start with the willingness to show the Jesus in your heart to others. We need to be able to recognize each other, then link arms...build His Church. Someone recently told me that evil exists in the absence of God. If that's true, all we need to do is bring God into our daily living and bring His light into the world.





From Carlyle Area: Take Rt 127 South for 6.4 miles. Turn RIGHT onto Rt 161 heading West for 6.3 miles. Turn RIGHT (heading North) on Bartelso Road. OR

Take Rt 127 South for 2.3 miles. Turn RIGHT onto Slant Road/County Hwy 1150 for 5.9 miles reaching Rt 161. Turn RIGHT onto Rt 161 heading West into Bartelso. Turn RIGHT (heading North) on Bartelso Road.

From the South:

From Pinckneyville Area: Take Rt 127 North for 32 miles to Rt 161. Turn LEFT onto Rt 161 into Bartelso. Turn RIGHT (heading North) on Bartelso Road.

"Farm Blessing" signs will guide you along the way. Those attending are invited to bring harvested grain, fruit, vegetables and garden produce in sealed, marked containers along with animals and farm machinery to be blessed.

You are encouraged to bring non-perishable food items to be donated to the local food pantry.


