



Sacramental Information

Baptisms: Parents/guardians are asked to attend a Preparation Seminar scheduled on the second Sunday of the month after 9:00 a.m. Mass (approximately 10:00 a.m.) in the lower-level library. We celebrate Baptisms on the first Sunday of the month during any Mass, and the third Sunday of the month after the 11:00 a.m. Mass. (No Baptisms are scheduled during Lent.) Please call the office to schedule at 281-5105.

Weddings: The parish is happy to celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony with adults who are currently registered members of Immaculate Conception Church (bride or groom). If you are one of many who would like to "come home" to celebrate the Sacrament with family and friends, please provide the name of the parish where you are now a member, along with contact information. We ask that you contact the IC Parish Office a minimum of four months prior to Marriage, but in most cases couples will need to allow time for Pre-Cana formation, and we suggest beginning to plan your Sacrament 12 or 18 months prior to Marriage.

Anointing of the Sick & Funerals: Since individual needs differ, please contact the Parish Office at 281-5105 for pastoral care. Do not hesitate to call; we are grateful for the opportunity to open our hearts to you and your family and offer these sacramental services.

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults): OCIA (formerly known as RCIA) is for everyone who has been drawn by God to form a deeper relationship. Wherever you are in your faith practice – baptized in another Christian faith, starting from the beginning, or simply enriching your Catholic practice – consider the OCIA. Get to know God better and find out what it means to be Catholic. Individuals will meet with our director of faith formation (Lizanne Young) to discuss the process. We meet as a group on Sundays (from Autumn through the Triduum just before Easter), starting with "Breaking Open the Word" dismissal from 9:00 a.m. Mass, and catechetical sessions from 10:00-11:30 a.m. Contact Lizanne at the Parish Office, 281-5105, ext. 354, or email lyoung@iccmail.org.

Reconciliation: Reconciliation is offered from 4:00-4:30 p.m. on Saturdays and by appointment.

SAVE TAXES ON IRA REQUIRED MINIMUM DISTRIBUTIONS

Individuals subject to Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) from their Individual Retirement Accounts (IRA) have an opportunity to use the distributions for charitable giving instead of taking a taxable distribution.

If you are age 70 ½ or older, the IRS will allow you to distribute up to \$105,000 annually directly to qualified nonprofit organizations without incurring any taxable income. The benefit is known as the Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD).

A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA, payable to a qualified charity, like Immaculate Conception Church. QCDs can be counted toward satisfying your required minimum distribution (RMD) for the year, if certain rules are met.

Here are the requirements:

- You must be 70½ or older to be eligible to make a QCD.
- QCDs are limited to the amount that would otherwise be taxed as ordinary income. This excludes non-deductible contributions.
- The maximum annual amount that can qualify for a QCD is \$105,000. This applies to the sum of QCDs made to one or more charities in a calendar year. (If, however, you file taxes jointly, your spouse can also make a QCD from his or her own IRA within the same tax year for up to \$105,000.)
- For a QCD to count towards your current year RMD, the funds must come out of your IRA by your RMD deadline, generally December 31.
- Any amount donated above your RMD does not count toward satisfying a future year.
- The QCD must be paid directly from your IRA to the charity to qualify.

In addition to the benefits of giving to charity, a QCD excludes the amount donated from taxable income, unlike regular withdrawals from an IRA. Keeping your taxable income lower may reduce the impact to certain tax credits and deductions, including Social Security and Medicare.

Also, QCDs require that you itemize, which, due to the tax law changes means you may decide to take advantage of the higher standard deduction, but still use a QCD for charitable giving.

Funds distributed directly to you, the IRA owner, which you then give to charity do not qualify as a QCD.

There are some other tax rules that may also apply to your situation, so consult with a financial professional for more details about this strategy.





ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY **ANNUAL REPORT 2024**

The mission of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul is to fulfill two great commandments: Love of God and love of neighbor. We seek to grow spiritually in our efforts to help those in need and to share our faith with those we serve.

During the fiscal year October 1, 2023-September 30, 2024 a total of \$27,466.00 was donated to our St. Vincent de Paul Society through the donation boxes at the church entrances, the Thanksgiving Day and Holy Thursday collections, memorials, and special individual and community organization donations. Another \$4,233.00 was collected from our various fundraisers.

Adverse economic conditions greatly affected parishioners of Immaculate Conception and Sacred Heart as well as nonparishioners from our neighbors in Columbia, Dupo and East Carondelet. During the fiscal year, we assisted 216 people by distributing \$25,484.00 for housing, utilities, food, medical expenses, transportation, Christmas children's gifts, and special needs.

We provided support to Cosgrove Kitchen in East St. Louis totaling \$9,789.00 for monthly lunches and weekly breakfasts, as well as for toiletries. We gave support and food for the Belleville Council Soup Bus totaling \$780.00, and support to C.U.P. (Catholic Urban Programs, East St. Louis) for essential needs items totaling \$934.00. We also distributed frozen casseroles totaling \$2,141.00. And, at our local nursing home, we provided a total of \$3,100.00 for monthly Bingo games, monthly birthday cupcakes, and Christmas gifts, plus we prayed the Rosary with them on Mondays.

The members of the St. Vincent de Paul Society of Immaculate Conception and Sacred Heart parishes are grateful for your generous donations of money which provide immediate assistance to those individuals and families when they need it most. We are also grateful for your donations of food and clothing for our Drives; your preparation of casseroles, and your prayers which enable us to continue to do God's work within our community.

Note: If any parishioner is aware of a person(s) in Columbia, Dupo and East Carondelet in need of temporary assistance due to unforeseen circumstances, whether it is food, clothing, utilities or housing, please do not hesitate to call the Parish Office at (618) 281-5105 and follow prompts to the St. Vincent de Paul line. Calls will be answered as soon as possible. All cases are strictly confidential.

St. Raymond's Corner

Did you know that St. Raymond's sends us a six-month financial report detailing how they use the money we send to them? Below is the biannual report we received.

For background reference:

- According to the IMF the average Yearly income in Guatemala is \$5,580.00.
- 20% of the GDP in Guatemala is in the form of remittances (money sent to Guatemala by someone in the household working in another country).
- \bullet 60% of the population lives below the poverty line
- The WHO says 21% of the population lives on less than \$1.00 a day.
- Sometimes the only good meal a family will get is the one provided by church at the end of Mass.

St. Raymond's received a total of \$17,619.00 between January and June of 2024.

Nuestra Señora de Candelaria is an extremely remote portion of St. Raymond's parish. Due to the remoteness, St. Raymond's is supporting Candelaria in establishing itself as a parish. There are certain building projects that must be met in order to submit an application to be a stand-alone parish. So, St. Raymond's forwards a portion of the money we send down to help this sub-parish achieve their goal.

This second set of numbers is how Nuestra Señora de Candelaria uses the \$3,250.00 from St. Raymond's.




