As part of Immaculate Conception's *Full-Stewardship Spirituality*, we will participate in our annual parish "Stewardship of Charity" giving practice from now through Sunday, February 16, 2025.

Each year we designate 2% of our previous year's collections to be given to various charitable organizations that serve the poor and align with Catholic Social Teaching (USCCB. org), especially the Option for the Poor and Vulnerable, and regard for Life and Dignity of the Human Person. To help as many organizations as possible, no charity may receive more than 10% of the fund, and groups that are regularly supported by our parish through envelopes or special events are not eligible. To date, we have given more than \$400,000 to charities selected by our parishioners.

We encourage all parish families to get involved in parish

gift-giving. *Every household that is a full-stewardship participant in our parish is welcome to nominate an organization* (one per household please). See the timeline at right for instructions, and visit the parish website for a complete list of guidelines (or contact the parish office).

Charities that have participated in the past may be nominated again, and new organizations that meet the criteria may be introduced. We are looking forward to helping as many as possible!

Voting to allocate funds will take place in person after Masses the weekends of February 8 & 9, and 15 & 16, and each household may cast up to 10 votes. This is an excellent opportunity for all ages to get involved in actively giving. Gather your family members and decide where your 10 votes will go.

Saturday, Feb. 8 - Sunday, Feb. 16......Vote! Voting takes place after all Masses these weekends. Each household may cast 10 votes! Saturday, Mar. 1 - Sunday, Mar. 2..... Results! After the Committee tabulates the votes, the funds will be allocated. Results will be published in this weekend's bulletin.

## Sacramental Information

**Baptisms:** Parents/guardians are asked to attend a Preparation Seminar scheduled on the second Sunday of the month after 9:00 a.m. Mass (approximately 10:00 a.m.) in the lower-level library. We celebrate Baptisms on the first Sunday of the month during any Mass, and the third Sunday of the month after the 11:00 a.m. Mass. (No Baptisms are scheduled during Lent.) Please call the office to schedule at 281-5105.

Weddings: The parish is happy to celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony with adults who are currently registered members of Immaculate Conception Church (bride or groom). If you are one of many who would like to "come home" to celebrate the Sacrament with family and friends, please provide the name of the parish where you are now a member, along with contact information. We ask that you contact the IC Parish Office a minimum of four months prior to Marriage, but in most cases couples will need to allow time for Pre-Cana formation, and we suggest beginning to plan your Sacrament 12 or 18 months prior to Marriage.

Anointing of the Sick & Funerals: Since individual needs differ, please contact the Parish Office at 281-5105 for pastoral care. Do not hesitate to call; we are grateful for the opportunity to open our hearts to you and your family and offer these sacramental services.

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults): OCIA (formerly known as RCIA) is for everyone who has been drawn by God to form a deeper relationship. Wherever you are in your faith practice – baptized in another Christian faith, starting from the beginning, or simply enriching your Catholic practice – consider the OCIA. Get to know God better and find out what it means to be Catholic. Individuals will meet with our director of faith formation (Lizanne Young) to discuss the process. We meet as a group on Sundays (from Autumn through the Triduum just before Easter), starting with "Breaking Open the Word" dismissal from 9:00 a.m. Mass, and catechetical sessions from 10:00-11:30 a.m. Contact Lizanne at the Parish Office, 281-5105, ext. 354, or email lyoung@iccmail.org. **Reconciliation:** Reconciliation is offered from 4:00-4:30 p.m. on Saturdays and by appointment.

#### WHY DONATE APPRECIATED STOCK TO CHARITY?

0Giving stock instead of cash as a charitable donation can greatly benefit the donor as well as the recipient. You will find that many charities, churches, schools, and other nonprofit organizations will accept stock as a gift.

Tax Benefits of Donating Stock to Charity

If the stock has increased in value from the time of purchase, the owner can avoid paying capital gains tax by donating the security to a qualified charitable organization. When an appreciated security held for at least a year is donated to a charitable organization, its fair market value may be itemized as an income tax deduction. The resulting tax savings could be factored in to make a larger donation. For publicly traded shares, the fair market value is the average of the high and low price on the transfer date.

Considerations:

- Many nonprofits, such as hospitals, schools, and various other organizations, will accept stock as a gift or donation.
- Giving stock often results in a larger donation to the organization, as the gift is tax-deductible and there are no capital gains taxes to pay.
- If your stock has risen in value since purchase, donating it directly is preferable, but if it has lost value, it may be more advantageous to sell it first and then donate the proceeds, so the giver can take the tax loss.
- Most organizations will immediately liquidate the donation, converting the stock to cash.
- Depending on the organization you donate to and your adjusted gross income, a varying amount of your donation may be able to be deducted on your taxes.
