Sacramental Information

Baptisms: Parents/guardians are asked to attend a Preparation Seminar scheduled on the second Sunday of the month after 9:00 a.m. Mass (approximately 10:00 a.m.) in the lower-level library. We celebrate Baptisms on the first Sunday of the month during any Mass, and the third Sunday of the month after the 11:00 a.m. Mass. (No Baptisms are scheduled during Lent.) Please call the office to schedule at 281-5105.

Weddings: The parish is happy to celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony with adults who are currently registered members of Immaculate Conception Church (bride or groom). If you are one of many who would like to "come home" to celebrate the Sacrament with family and friends, please provide the name of the parish where you are now a member, along with contact information. We ask that you contact the IC Parish Office a minimum of four months prior to Marriage, but in most cases couples will need to allow time for Pre-Cana formation, and we suggest beginning to plan your Sacrament 12 or 18 months prior to Marriage.

Anointing of the Sick & Funerals: Since individual needs differ, please contact the Parish Office at 281-5105 for pastoral care. Do not hesitate to call; we are grateful for the opportunity to open our hearts to you and your family and offer these sacramental services.

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults): OCIA (formerly known as RCIA) is for everyone who has been drawn by God to form a deeper relationship. Wherever you are in your faith practice – baptized in another Christian faith, starting from the beginning, or simply enriching your Catholic practice – consider the OCIA. Get to know God better and find out what it means to be Catholic. Individuals will meet with our director of faith formation (Lizanne Young) to discuss the process. We meet as a group on Sundays (from Autumn through the Triduum just before Easter), starting with "Breaking Open the Word" dismissal from 9:00 a.m. Mass, and catechetical sessions from 10:00-11:30 a.m. Contact Lizanne at the Parish Office, 281-5105, ext. 354, or email lyoung@iccmail.org.

Reconciliation: Reconciliation is offered from 4:00-4:30 p.m. on Saturdays and by appointment.

THE IMPORTANCE OF NAMING BENEFICIARIES

What do I need to know?

Taking the time to choose your beneficiaries now can help your family avoid probate later. Please tell your family or friends if you have selected them as a beneficiary, because your beneficiaries must contact your investment firm themselves to receive their assets. Your assets can then be distributed to your beneficiaries without requiring a will or other legal documents. You will need to assign at least one beneficiary for each account; most of the time you can add, change, or delete your beneficiaries online. To get started, you will need to provide the following for each beneficiary:

- Beneficiary type (e.g., spouse, non-spouse, trust, entity)
- Full name
- Date of birth
- Social Security number (optional)

You can also name contingent beneficiaries. Contingent beneficiaries receive your assets if there is no living primary beneficiary. Note: Some retirement accounts or plans may require spousal consent (e.g., profit sharing, self-employed, 401(k), Keogh) before you can add or change the beneficiary.

What to expect

After you have updated your beneficiaries:

- If you've updated online, and no additional consent or paperwork is needed, your changes will be effective in just a few minutes.
- If spousal consent is required, your beneficiaries will typically be updated within three business days after the paperwork is received or email approval.

You can name your favorite charity (such as church or school) as beneficiary of your insurance, annuity, real estate or other financial investments. Contact your attorney or investment firm for more information or assistance. Caution: Changing a beneficiary is a change to your estate plan. You should review any planned change with your attorney prior to implementing it.

LENTEN PRAYER CARDS

The three traditional pillars of Lent are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Through the three pillars of Lent, we journey to develop a closer relationship to God. To help you with the first of the three pillars, prayer, we are offering Lenten prayer cards.

As you leave Mass today, you will have the opportunity to accept a prayer card and spiritually "adopt" a parishioner for your journey through Lent. This person may be someone preparing for Confirmation, the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults, a Seminarian, or a homebound parishioner. There are plenty of cards for each to take one, the extra cards will be placed in the gathering space for those who did not get a card today.

The card has a space that says "I commit to." This is where you record your personal commitment to your prayer recipient.

What types of prayer might you offer? You could...

- Offer daily prayer using the Glory Be, Our Father, Hail Mary, Memorare, or other favorite prayer
- Recite the Holy Rosary or Chaplet of Divine Mercy
- Attend extra Masses
- Participate in weekly Adoration, or
- Spend time daily to reflect on your adopted Parishioner's journey and offer a spontaneous prayer requesting a special blessing for the challenges they may face.

Over the next few days, consider what you can do to spiritually help your adopted Parishioner on their journey. This is "spiritual" assistance, not material or physical. We ask only that you pray for them.

When you decide what you will do, write the commitment on the card and sign your name. Keep this card handy as a daily reminder of your commitment as you journey through a prayerful Lent.

Turn in the card during Holy Week using the collection basket, or the box in the Gathering Space. The cards will then be distributed to your adopted Parishioner as tangible evidence of your caring for them.






