### Sacramental Information

**Baptisms:** Parents/guardians are asked to attend a Preparation Seminar scheduled on the second Sunday of the month after 9:00 a.m. Mass (approximately 10:00 a.m.) in the lower-level library. We celebrate Baptisms on the first Sunday of the month during any Mass, and the third Sunday of the month after the 11:00 a.m. Mass. (No Baptisms are scheduled during Lent.) Please call the office to schedule at 281-5105.

Weddings: The parish is happy to celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony with adults who are currently registered members of Immaculate Conception Church (bride or groom). If you are one of many who would like to "come home" to celebrate the Sacrament with family and friends, please provide the name of the parish where you are now a member, along with contact information. We ask that you contact the IC Parish Office a minimum of four months prior to Marriage, but in most cases, couples will need to allow time for Pre-Cana formation, and we suggest beginning to plan your Sacrament 12 or 18 months prior to Marriage. Anointing of the Sick & Funerals: Since individual needs differ, please contact the Parish Office at 281-5105 for pastoral care. Do not hesitate to call; we are grateful for the opportunity to open our hearts to you and your family and offer these sacramental services.

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults): OCIA (formerly known as RCIA) is for everyone who has been drawn by God to form a deeper relationship. Wherever you are in your faith practice – baptized in another Christian faith, starting from the beginning, or simply enriching your Catholic practice – consider the OCIA. Get to know God better and find out what it means to be Catholic. Individuals will meet with our director of faith formation (Lizanne Young) to discuss the process. We meet as a group on Sundays (from Autumn through the Triduum just before Easter), starting with "Breaking Open the Word" dismissal from 9:00 a.m. Mass, and catechetical sessions from 10:00-11:30 a.m. Contact Lizanne at the Parish Office, 281-5105, ext. 354, or email lyoung@iccmail.org.

**Reconciliation:** Reconciliation is offered from 4:00-4:30 p.m. on Saturdays and by appointment.

# Ministry News & Happenings

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

Erma was on her way to the airport, preparing to catch a flight to Chicago's O'Hare. She got to her gate in plenty of time and as she waited to board the plane, she got out her book that she had been wanting to crack open for a long time, but never had the chance to do it. It felt so good just to sit there and not be bothered by anyone; just Erma and her book.

Then Erma heard a voice. "I bet it's cold in Chicago." It was an elderly woman sitting next to her. Without looking up from her book, she muttered, "It probably is." The elderly woman continued to talk. Erma continued to give short, unfeeling responses.

Then the elderly woman dropped a bombshell. She was taking the body of her dead husband back to Chicago to be buried. He had died suddenly, after 53 years of marriage. Erma's heart skipped a beat. All of a sudden she realized that the elderly woman sitting next to her was a suffering soul. She just wanted to be heard. She needed another human being so badly that she turned to a complete stranger. The elderly woman wasn't seeking money or advice. She just wanted somebody, anybody, to listen to her.

Erma put down her book, held the woman's hand and listened. Then, all of a sudden, it was time to board. The two women walked arm-in-arm down the jetway. They were sitting a few rows apart from each other. As Erma was getting settled in her seat, she heard the elderly woman say to the person next to her, "I bet it's cold in Chicago." Erma silently prayed, "Dear God, please give

the person in the seat next to that poor woman the grace to listen patiently and lovingly."

This story has some similarities to today's Gospel parable of the rich man and Lazarus the beggar. The needs of Lazarus are small and it would take very little for the rich man to help him. The rich man's sin is not in his wealth, nor is it that he kicked Lazarus off his property or would yell and demean Lazarus. None of that stuff. The rich man's sin was that he paid no attention to Lazarus. His sin was ignoring Lazarus, It is a sin of omission, that is, not doing something he should have done. He didn't lift a finger to help someone that would have taken very little effort on his part.

As I see it, these sins of omission are all around us. We can respond in one of three ways. First, we can do what the rich man did in the Gospel. We can close our eyes to the situation, ignore it, pretend it doesn't exist and go on our merry way. Second, we can do what many good people are doing today: They don't ignore it. They actually say something and speak out against it. But that's all they do. Third, instead of closing our eyes to the situation or instead of cursing the darkness produced by the situation, we can light a candle to dispel the darkness and actually do something about it.

Many of us know that it's all too easy to insulate ourselves from uncomfortable situations or situations that can get in the way of our plans and activities. I've been guilty of that before. May we strive to see, recognize and act when the Lazarus' of our lives present themselves to us.


