This year, All Souls' Day falls on Sunday, November 2 and will be celebrated at the 11:00 a.m. Mass. In remembrance of All Souls, as in the past, all parishioners who have lost a loved one this past year are invited to attend in remembrance of their spouse, mother, father, child, brother or sister. All parishioners are welcome to attend this memorial. Mass Candles are a large part of our faith and lifestyle. This is the season of Jack O'Lanterns, firelight, window lighting, Baptism candles, birthday candles, candles during power outages to provide light, and the Unity candle in a marriage ceremony. We ask God to "Light our way" and believe, He is "our light in times of sorrow."

**Baptisms:** Parents/guardians are asked to attend a Preparation Seminar scheduled on the second Sunday of the month after 9:00 a.m. Mass (approximately 10:00 a.m.) in the lower-level library. We celebrate Baptisms on the first Sunday of the month during any Mass, and the third Sunday of the month after the 11:00 a.m. Mass. (No Baptisms are scheduled during Lent.) Please call the office to schedule at 281-5105.

Weddings: The parish is happy to celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony with adults who are currently registered members of Immaculate Conception Church (bride or groom). If you are one of many who would like to "come home" to celebrate the Sacrament with family and friends, please provide the name of the parish where you are now a member, along with contact information. We ask that you contact the IC Parish Office a minimum of four months prior to Marriage, but in most cases, couples will need to allow time for Pre-Cana formation, and we suggest beginning to plan your Sacrament 12 or 18 months prior to Marriage. Anointing of the Sick & Funerals: Since individual needs differ, please contact the Parish Office at 281-5105 for pastoral care. Do not hesitate to call; we are grateful for the opportunity to open our hearts to you and your family and offer

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults): OCIA (formerly known as RCIA) is for everyone who has been drawn by God to form a deeper relationship. Wherever you are in your faith practice – baptized in another Christian faith, starting from the beginning, or simply enriching your Catholic practice – consider the OCIA. Get to know God better and find out what it means to be Catholic. Individuals will meet with our director of faith formation (Lizanne Young) to discuss the process. We meet as a group on Sundays (from Autumn through the Triduum just before Easter), starting with "Breaking Open the Word" dismissal from 9:00 a.m. Mass, and catechetical sessions from 10:00-11:30 a.m. Contact Lizanne at the Parish Office, 281-5105, ext. 354, or email lyoung@iccmail.org.

### SAVE TAXES ON IRA REQUIRED MINIMUM DISTRIBUTIONS

Individuals subject to Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) from their Individual Retirement Accounts (IRA) have an opportunity to use the distributions for charitable giving instead of taking a taxable distribution. If you are age 70½ or older, the IRS will allow you to distribute up to \$108,000 annually directly to qualified nonprofit organizations without incurring any taxable income. The benefit is known as the Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA, payable to a qualified charity, like Immaculate Conception Church or School. QCDs can be counted toward satisfying your required minimum distribution (RMD) for the year, if certain rules are met.

#### Here are the requirements:

- You must be 70½ or older to be eligible to make a QCD.
- QCDs are limited to the amount that would otherwise be taxed as ordinary income. This excludes non-deductible contributions.
- The maximum annual amount that can qualify for a QCD is \$108,000. This applies to the sum of QCDs made to one or more charities in a calendar year. (If, however, you file taxes jointly, your spouse can also make a QCD from his or her own IRA within the same tax year for up to \$108,000.)
- For a QCD to count toward your current year RMD, the funds must come out of your IRA by your RMD deadline, generally December 31.
- Any amount donated above your RMD does not count toward satisfying a future year RMD.
- The QCD must be paid directly from your IRA to the charity to qualify. In addition to the benefits of giving to charity, a QCD excludes the amount donated from taxable income, unlike regular withdrawals from an IRA. Keeping your taxable income lower may reduce the impact to certain tax credits and deductions, including Social Security and Medicare. Also, QCDs require that you itemize, which, due to the tax law changes means you may decide to take advantage of the higher standard deduction, but still use a QCD for charitable giving.

Funds distributed directly to you, the IRA owner, which you then give to charity do not qualify as a QCD. There are some other tax rules that may also apply to your situation, so consult with a financial professional for more details about this strategy.

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

Once upon a time, there was a young woman who died and went to heaven. Her life on earth had been bad - very bad. When she arrived at the gates of heaven, she was told that she could be admitted to heaven on only one condition: She must return to earth and bring back the gift that God values above all other gifts.

So the young woman returned to earth. There she thought and thought about what gift God values above all other gifts. Then one day she came upon a guy who had just died for his faith in God. "Ah!" she thought, "this is indeed the gift that God values most: the blood of someone who has died for his or her faith." So she took the drop of the man's blood and brought it back to heaven. An angel told her to go back to earth; there was something that God values more than the blood of martyrs.

So she returned to earth again and deeply pondered what God values more than the blood of someone who died for their faith. Then she came upon an old missionary preaching God's word among the poor. "Ah!" she thought, "this is indeed the gift God values most: the sweat of the brow of someone who has spent his or her life bringing the Good News of salvation to the poor." But when she presented it to heaven, she was told that there was something that God values even more highly than this.

So back to earth she goes: again and again and again she went back to heaven with precious gifts, but each time she was told that there's still something that God values more highly.

Finally, one day when she was about to give up, she came upon a child playing at a fountain. The child's face was beautiful and innocent. Then a man on horseback rode up. He dismounted to get a drink at the fountain. When the man saw the child, he remembered his own childhood innocence.

Then the man peered into the fountain's water and saw

the reflection of his own face. It was worn, hardened and filled with sadness and regret. As he stared at his image in the water, he suddenly realized how wrongly he had wasted his life that God had given him. And at that moment, tears of repentance welled up in his eyes and rolled down his cheeks and fell into the fountain.

The young woman took one of the man's tears and brought it back to heaven. When she presented it, there was great joy among the angels and saints. This was, indeed, the gift God values most: the tears of a repentant sinner.

In today's Gospel, two men are praying. The first, a Pharisee, a learned scholar of Jewish law and practices, and second, a Jewish tax collector who took money from his fellow Jews and gave it to the enemy, the Roman occupiers. The Pharisee had rank, status, honor and esteem. The tax collector was hated by all the Jews for collaborating with the enemy. Yet God goes much deeper than human opinions and feelings. God looks at the heart, the core of every soul.

The tax collector's prayer is from the heart. It's honest, genuine, real. The Pharisee's prayer, to me, sounds arrogant, condescending, even judgmental.

The challenge is for our prayer to be meaningful, honest, authentic. Superficial thoughts and feelings and prayers by rote won't cut it when we're praying, really praying to God, the forgiver and healer of souls. We've got to pray from the heart and nothing short of that. I think God is more interested in the quality of our prayers than quantity. A prayer that's direct, brutally honest and to the point is a sincere prayer that pierces the heart of God.

Spend a little time reflecting on your prayer life, your conversation with God. Could it use a bit of an upgrade? Something to think about....
