## Sacramental Information

**Baptisms:** Parents/guardians are asked to attend a Preparation Seminar scheduled on the second Sunday of the month after 9:00 a.m. Mass (approximately 10:00 a.m.) in the lower-level library. We celebrate Baptisms on the first Sunday of the month during any Mass, and the third Sunday of the month after the 11:00 a.m. Mass. (No Baptisms are scheduled during Lent.) Please call the office to schedule at 281-5105.

Weddings: The parish is happy to celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony with adults who are currently registered members of Immaculate Conception Church (bride or groom). If you are one of many who would like to "come home" to celebrate the Sacrament with family and friends, please provide the name of the parish where you are now a member, along with contact information. We ask that you contact the IC Parish Office a minimum of four months prior to Marriage, but in most cases, couples will need to allow time for Pre-Cana formation, and we suggest beginning to plan your Sacrament 12 or 18 months prior to Marriage. Anointing of the Sick & Funerals: Since individual needs differ, please contact the Parish Office at 281-5105 for pastoral care. Do not hesitate to call; we are grateful for the opportunity to open our hearts to you and your family and offer these sacramental services.

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults): OCIA (formerly known as RCIA) is for everyone who has been drawn by God to form a deeper relationship. Wherever you are in your faith practice – baptized in another Christian faith, starting from the beginning, or simply enriching your Catholic practice – consider the OCIA. Get to know God better and find out what it means to be Catholic. Individuals will meet with our director of faith formation (Lizanne Young) to discuss the process. We meet as a group on Sundays (from Autumn through the Triduum just before Easter), starting with "Breaking Open the Word" dismissal from 9:00 a.m. Mass, and catechetical sessions from 10:00-11:30 a.m. Contact Lizanne at the Parish Office, 281-5105, ext. 354, or email lyoung@iccmail.org.

**Reconciliation:** Reconciliation is offered from 4:00-4:30 p.m. on Saturdays and by appointment.

Happy October everyone!

As we start to see the weather, leaves, and schedules change, I would like to introduce you to the new character trait of the month we are working on at IC: Responsibility.

The littles in our school will learn what it means to have Responsibility in our words and actions, and our older kids will navigate how having responsibility can foster freedom and trust. For us IC adults, I challenge you to consider what we are responsible for as Christians. Here are a few notable instructions from God to ponder:

- Love God with deed, word, and Sabbath (Deut 6:4-6, Ex 20:1-17)
- Care for the earth and all its creatures (Genesis 1:26-29) including...
  - Our neighbor (Mt 22:34-40), regardless of their status (Gal 3:26-29) or whether they pray like you (Lk 10:29-37)
  - o Our parents (Ex 20:12)
  - o And the most vulnerable (Mt 25:31-46)
- Do no wrong against others, such as...
  - Killing, stealing, adultery, telling lies, or acting with greed (Ex 20:13-17)
- Tell everyone about the Gospel (Mk 16:15)

While this is not everything God commands (I don't think they would let me print the whole Bible), I encourage you to reflect on these responsibilities and others we hear about in Scripture to see where your heart struggles the most. Then, I encourage you to bring your struggle to God in prayer and see where He can sow growth in your life.



"We are called to be signs of hope to all people, especially those whose goodness, value, and dignity are undermined. As members of the Body of Christ, we carry this hope with us as we continue Jesus' mission on earth... 


