



Greetings friends,

So what kinds of things can deacons do? Deacons, just like priests, promise obedience to the bishop and serve where the bishop assigns them to serve. Most deacons are married, employed outside the church, and have families. Deacons do not receive any compensation. Yep – completely volunteer. Deacons are called to serve in a threefold ministry – liturgy, charity,

and word. This generally includes: assist at Mass, proclaim the Gospel, preach the homily, provide faith formation, preside at Baptisms and Marriages and Funerals (without a Mass), participate in various parish councils/committees, visit the homebound and nursing homes, serve the poor and those in need, and any other needs of the parish and pastor. Deacons do not hear Confessions, anoint the sick, confirm, celebrate Eucharist, or ordain; those are reserved for priests. Sacramental Information

Baptisms: Parents/guardians are asked to attend a Preparation Seminar scheduled on the second Sunday of the month after 9:00 a.m. Mass (approximately 10:00 a.m.) in the lower-level library. We celebrate Baptisms on the first Sunday of the month during any Mass, and the third Sunday of the month after the 11:00 a.m. Mass. (No Baptisms are scheduled during Lent.) Please call the office to schedule at 281-5105.

Weddings: The parish is happy to celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony with adults who are currently registered members of Immaculate Conception Church (bride or groom). If you are one of many who would like to "come home" to celebrate the Sacrament with family and friends, please provide the name of the parish where you are now a member, along with contact information. We ask that you contact the IC Parish Office a minimum of four months prior to Marriage, but in most cases, couples will need to allow time for Pre-Cana formation, and we suggest beginning to plan your Sacrament 12 or 18 months prior to Marriage.

Anointing of the Sick & Funerals: Since individual needs differ, please contact the Parish Office at 281-5105 for pastoral care. Do not hesitate to call; we are grateful for the opportunity to open our hearts to you and your family and offer these sacramental services.

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults): OCIA (formerly known as RCIA) is for everyone who has been drawn by God to form a deeper relationship. Wherever you are in your faith practice – baptized in another Christian faith, starting from the beginning, or simply enriching your Catholic practice – consider the OCIA. Get to know God better and find out what it means to be Catholic. Individuals will meet with our director of faith formation (Lizanne Young) to discuss the process. We meet as a group on Sundays (from Autumn through the Triduum just before Easter), starting with "Breaking Open the Word" dismissal from 9:00 a.m. Mass, and catechetical sessions from 10:00-11:30 a.m. Contact Lizanne at the Parish Office, 281-5105, ext. 354, or email lyoung@iccmail.org.

Reconciliation: Reconciliation is offered from 4:00-4:30 p.m. on Saturdays and by appointment.

SAVE TAXES ON IRA REQUIRED MINIMUM DISTRIBUTIONS

Individuals subject to Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) from their Individual Retirement Accounts (IRA) have an opportunity to use the distributions for charitable giving instead of taking a taxable distribution. If you are age 70½ or older, the IRS will allow you to distribute up to \$108,000 annually directly to qualified nonprofit organizations without incurring any taxable income. The benefit is known as the Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA, payable to a qualified charity, like Immaculate Conception Church or School. QCDs can be counted toward satisfying your required minimum distribution (RMD) for the year, if certain rules are met.

Here are the requirements:

- You must be 70½ or older to be eligible to make a QCD.
- QCDs are limited to the amount that would otherwise be taxed as ordinary income. This excludes non-deductible contributions.
- The maximum annual amount that can qualify for a QCD is \$108,000. This applies to the sum of QCDs made to one or more charities in a calendar year. (If, however, you file taxes jointly, your spouse can also make a QCD from his or her own IRA within the same tax year for up to \$108,000.)
- For a QCD to count toward your current year RMD, the funds must come out of your IRA by your RMD deadline, generally December 31.
- Any amount donated above your RMD does not count toward satisfying a future year RMD.
- The QCD must be paid directly from your IRA to the charity to qualify. In addition to the benefits of giving to charity, a QCD excludes the amount donated from taxable income, unlike regular withdrawals from an IRA. Keeping your taxable income lower may reduce the impact to certain tax credits and deductions, including Social Security and Medicare. Also, QCDs require that you itemize, which, due to the tax law changes means you may decide to take advantage of the higher standard deduction, but still use a QCD for charitable giving.

Funds distributed directly to you, the IRA owner, which you then give to charity do not qualify as a QCD. There are some other tax rules that may also apply to your situation, so consult with a financial professional for more details about this strategy.

SVDP

The Immaculate Conception Society of St. Vincent de Paul Conference works to carry out the mission of the Society: A network of friends, inspired by Gospel values, growing in holiness and building a more just world through personal relationships with and service to people in need.

One way we carry out this mission is to provide direct help to individuals in need with food, rent and utility bills among other things. Sadly, our hotline gets many calls each month from people who, for a variety of reasons, cannot make ends meet. The help we give is limited – we do not provide continuous aid – just a hand up to avert a crisis. Who do we help? Following is a brief synopsis of how we recently helped a neighbor in need:

Ms. S. left an abusive marriage with little more than her clothing and a car. The only furniture in her apartment was a cot. Ms. S. holds two jobs to make ends meet — one full-time and one part-time. She needed support to get on her feet and was referred to House of Neighborly Service. Our St. Vincent de Paul hotline team occasionally partners with HONS and we did so for Ms. S. Through our joint efforts she was able to cover one of her many bills and continue on the road to healing and self-sufficiency.

Your generous support of the ICC St. Vincent de Paul Conference makes it possible for people like Ms. S. to avoid sliding into a never ending cycle of missed payments which only leads to much bigger problems.

Thank you for your prayers, financial support and participation in the casserole program, food drives, coat drive and other activities we operate to help those in need. We are grateful to the parish for donating the proceeds from the Thanksgiving Mass collection which helps us get through the cold months, a particularly busy time for client calls.




