Sacramental Information

Baptisms: Parents/guardians are asked to attend a Preparation Seminar scheduled on the second Sunday of the month after 9:00 a.m. Mass (approximately 10:00 a.m.) in the lower-level library. We celebrate Baptisms on the first Sunday of the month during any Mass, and the third Sunday of the month after the 11:00 a.m. Mass. (No Baptisms are scheduled during Lent.) Please call the office to schedule at 281-5105.

Weddings: The parish is happy to celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony with adults who are currently registered members of Immaculate Conception Church (bride or groom). If you are one of many who would like to "come home" to celebrate the Sacrament with family and friends, please provide the name of the parish where you are now a member, along with contact information. We ask that you contact the IC Parish Office a minimum of four months prior to Marriage, but in most cases, couples will need to allow time for Pre-Cana formation, and we suggest beginning to plan your Sacrament 12 or 18 months prior to Marriage.

Anointing of the Sick & Funerals: Since individual needs differ, please contact the Parish Office at 281-5105 for pastoral care. Do not hesitate to call; we are grateful for the opportunity to open our hearts to you and your family and offer these sacramental services.

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults): OCIA (formerly known as RCIA) is for everyone who has been drawn by God to form a deeper relationship. Wherever you are in your faith practice – baptized in another Christian faith, starting from the beginning, or simply enriching your Catholic practice – consider the OCIA. Get to know God better and find out what it means to be Catholic. Individuals will meet with our director of faith formation (Lizanne Young) to discuss the process. We meet as a group on Sundays (from Autumn through the Triduum just before Easter), starting with "Breaking Open the Word" dismissal from 9:00 a.m. Mass, and catechetical sessions from 10:00-11:30 a.m. Contact Lizanne at the Parish Office, 281-5105, ext. 354, or email lyoung@iccmail.org.

Reconciliation: Reconciliation is offered from 4:00-4:30 p.m. on Saturdays and by appointment.

- When the tax law changes
- When you have life changes:
 - Lifestyle – Marriage, divorce, birth or adoption of a child, home purchase, retirement, filing chapter 11 bankruptcy
 - Wage income – You or your spouse start or stop working or start or stop a second job
 - Taxable income not subject to withholding – Interest income, dividends, capital gains, self-employment income, IRA (including certain Roth IRA) distributions
 - Adjustments to income – IRA deduction, student loan interest deduction, alimony expense
 - Itemized deductions or tax credits – Medical expenses, taxes, interest expense, gifts to charity, dependent care expenses, education credit, child tax credit, earned income credit

To Change Your Withholding:

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

In our first reading today, Isaiah presents the people of Israel with a simple proposition: If they help the poor and needy in their midst, God will immediately hear their prayers and heal them. The implication is clear: The people have not shared what they had with the hungry. They have not sheltered the homeless, they have not clothed the naked. Because of this, God refuses to hear them, leaving them in their self-inflicted gloom and darkness. But, Isaiah insists, if they turn away from false and malicious speech and satisfy the hunger of the afflicted, God's light will rise on them until it is as bright as high noon on a summer day.


In the Gospel, Jesus also uses the metaphor of light to describe His disciples. They will shine before others, not to bring glory to themselves, but so that people will see their good deeds and give glory to God.

How powerful that the poor become a light for the world to see, and more importantly, that they reveal the face of God! The light that breaks forth is like a moment of clarity when we see things as they really are. God is present all the time, but the humblest of people and the simplest of actions pull back the curtain and give the world a glimpse of who God is and where we can find God.

Years ago, when I was doing missionary work in northern Peru, one of the places we went to once or twice a month for Mass was a little town called Naranja (which means "orange"). There were about 500 people in this village. It was in the mountains, and they had no roads or electricity. The whole town only had two Coleman lanterns. But everyone had a small oil lamp or two, much like those used in Jesus' time, to light their homes. The church had a large frame hanging from its ceiling. Cut into the frame were a hundred slots into which the small oil lamps could be placed. The Masses were always in the evening. We were very close to the equator, so the sun would always set year-round at about 6:00 p.m. When the people came to Mass, they were carrying their oil lamps from their homes to guide them through the darkness. When they came to the church, the people would place their lamps in the slots. By the time the last person came, the darkness of the church was transformed into a glorious sea of light. Then, after the Mass and prayers, they would take their lamps and head home.

We all have the light of Christ given to us from our Baptism. And when we gather as Christian community, that light really shines. Strengthened by the Eucharist, the Scriptures and each other, we carry that light back into our world. Jesus tells us in today's Gospel to let our light shine. Try to be a beacon of hope, of light. As St. Pope John XXIII said, "Every believer in this world must become a spark of light." May your light shine this week and bring some hope, joy and faith to a world that could really use it.
