THE MONTH OF MAY IS A BUSY MONTH.

Mother's Day, Graduations, Confirmations and First Communions, parties for all these occasions, vacations to start the summer...it is a lot.

Amongst all of these events, May is also recognized as Mental Health Awareness Month across the United States. You might be wondering, "Mrs. Shea, why do we need a whole month to talk about mental health? I'm not struggling." Here are some fast facts* that might shine some light on why I talk about mental health so much:

- According to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Association (SAMHSA), 1 in 5 adults in the US experiences symptoms of mental illness each year.
- In 2022 & 2023, 77.09% of all adults with a substance use disorder did not receive treatment, and 9.2% of adults with any mental illness (roughly over 5 million people) were uninsured.
- The National Institute of Mental Health lists suicide as the 2nd leading cause of death for children and adults ages 10-34 (only beaten by unintentional injury).
- In a survey conducted in 2024, there were roughly 320 individuals seeking treatment for every 1 mental health provider in the country.

In short, mental illness impacts a LOT of people regardless of age, race, religion, or income. Whether it is a family member, a spouse, a child, or you yourself that struggles with a mental illness – this month is for you. To know that you are not alone. To know that you are seen and heard. And to know that there are people out there who can help, myself included.

I would like to express my sincerest gratitude to every one of you for contributing to my ability to be at this parish. The past four years have been a time for planting seeds of growth, and I hope one day that Immaculate Conception can be known as a community where anyone can walk through our doors and find a person or group to help them not just spiritually, but mentally and emotionally. If you or someone you know needs to talk about anything, please do not hesitate to call or stop by and talk to me.

Sacramental Information

Baptisms: Parents/guardians are asked to attend a Preparation Seminar scheduled on the second Sunday of the month after 9:00 a.m. Mass (approximately 10:00 a.m.) in the lower-level library. We celebrate Baptisms on the first Sunday of the month during any Mass, and the third Sunday of the month after the 11:00 a.m. Mass. (No Baptisms are scheduled during Lent.) Please call the office to schedule at 281-5105.

Weddings: The parish is happy to celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony with adults who are currently registered members of Immaculate Conception Church (bride or groom). If you are one of many who would like to “come home” to celebrate the Sacrament with family and friends, please provide the name of the parish where you are now a member, along with contact information. We ask that you contact the IC Parish Office a minimum of four months prior to Marriage, but in most cases, couples will need to allow time for Pre-Cana formation, and we suggest beginning to plan your Sacrament 12 or 18 months prior to Marriage.

Anointing of the Sick & Funerals: Since individual needs differ, please contact the Parish Office at 281-5105 for pastoral care. Do not hesitate to call; we are grateful for the opportunity to open our hearts to you and your family and offer these sacramental services.

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults): OCIA (formerly known as RCIA) is for everyone who has been drawn by God to form a deeper relationship. Wherever you are in your faith practice – baptized in another Christian faith, starting from the beginning, or simply enriching your Catholic practice – consider the OCIA. Get to know God better and find out what it means to be Catholic. Individuals will meet with our director of faith formation (Lizanne Young) to discuss the process. We meet as a group on Sundays (from Autumn through the Triduum just before Easter), starting with “Breaking Open the Word” dismissal from 9:00 a.m. Mass, and catechetical sessions from 10:00-11:30 a.m. Contact Lizanne at the Parish Office, 281-5105, ext. 354, or email lyoung@iccmil.org.

Reconciliation: Reconciliation is offered from 4:00-4:30 p.m. on Saturdays and by appointment.

Please be proactive! *EVERYONE must have an IL state background check, as well as doing the online refresher and filling out CANTS forms. *Coaches and employees will need to be fingerprinted in addition to the usual Child Protection paperwork. *The initial course is now available online. WHY DONATE APPRECIATED STOCK OR MUTUAL FUNDS TO CHARITY?

Giving stocks or mutual funds instead of cash as a charitable donation can greatly benefit the donor as well as the recipient. You will find that many charities, churches, schools, and other nonprofit organizations will accept stock or mutual funds as a gift.

Tax Benefits of Donating Stock or Mutual Funds to Charity

If the stock or mutual fund has increased in value from the time of purchase, the owner can avoid paying long-term capital gains tax by donating the security to a qualified charitable organization. When an appreciated security held for a minimum of one year is donated to a charitable organization, its fair market value may be itemized as an income tax deduction if the donor is eligible to itemize on their tax filing. The resulting tax savings could be factored in to allow for a larger donation. For publicly traded shares, the fair market value is the average of the high and low price on the transfer date.

Considerations:

- Many nonprofits, such as hospitals, schools, and various other organizations, will accept stock or mutual funds as a gift or donation.
- Giving securities often results in a larger donation to the organization, as the gift is tax-deductible and there are no long-term capital gains taxes to pay.
- If your security has risen in value since purchase, donating it directly is preferable, but if it has lost value, it may be more advantageous to sell it first and then donate the proceeds, so you can take the tax loss.
- Most organizations will immediately liquidate the donation, converting the security to cash.
- Depending on the organization you donate to and your adjusted gross income, a varying amount of your donation may be able to be deducted on your taxes.

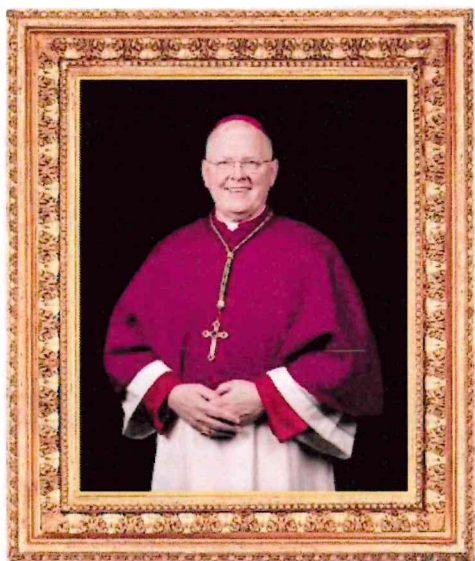

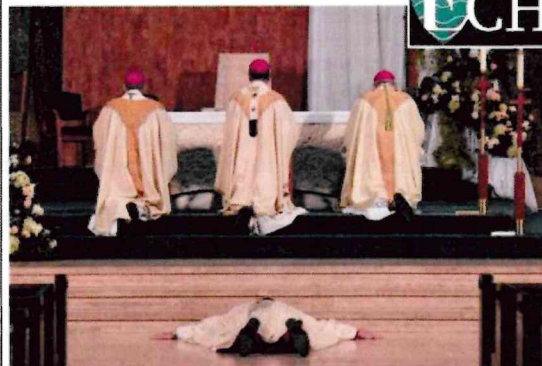

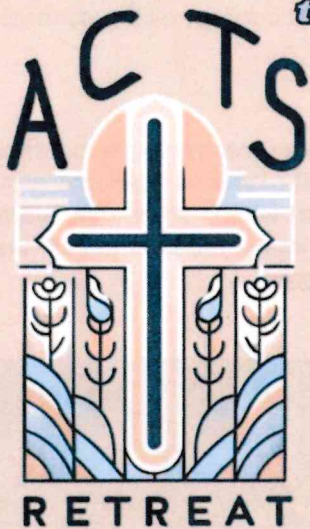

RESPECT LIFE CORNER

On the Second Sunday of Easter, the Church celebrates the Sunday of Divine Mercy. It provides an important opportunity to share Christ's message of mercy, especially with those who suffer because of their participation in one or more abortions. 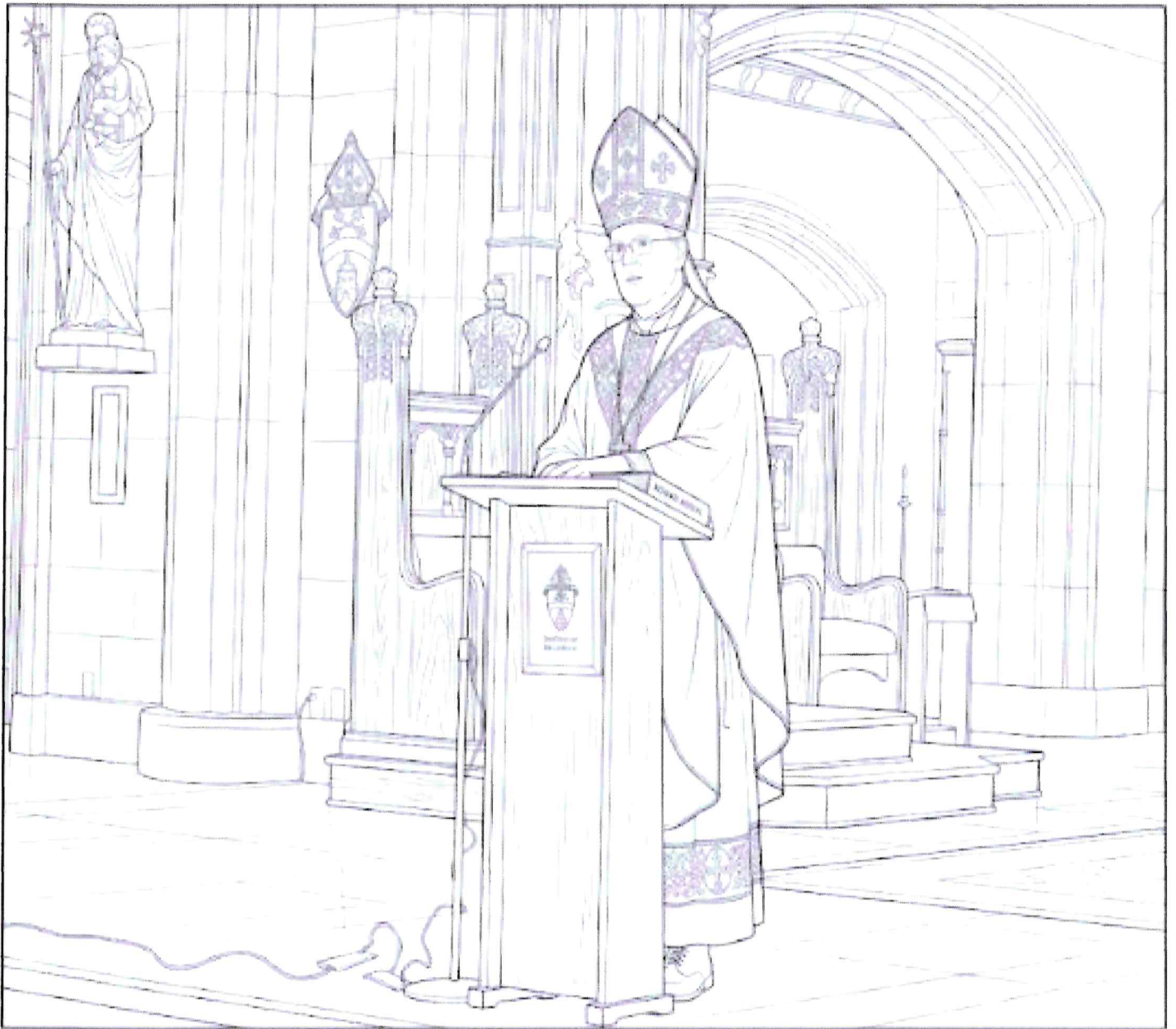

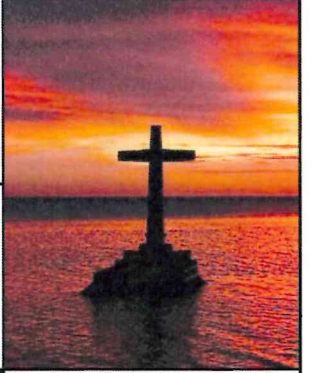
